When to Report

Your suspicion of child abuse and neglect is enough to make a report. You are not required to provide proof, but your report must be made in good faith. Failure to report or knowingly making a false report can lead to criminal and/or civil liability.

Anonymous in Indiana

Some of the behavioral signs listed below may be an indicator of something other than abuse or neglect; however, any indicator which gives one "reason to believe" that abuse or neglect is occurring should be reported.

- A child has frequent or unexplained bruises or injuries, especially on the fleshy areas of the body (face, arms, the back of legs)
- Child appears nervous around adults and/or caregiver(s)
- Child has severe poor hygiene, begs for or steals food or states that no one at home provides care
- · Hears a caregiver blame, berate, or belittle a child and/or refuses to help the child when needed
- · Child acts out sexually or shows interests in sex that is inappropriate for that age or development
- Animal abuse and neglect is often a strong indicator of child abuse. Be concerned if witnessed and children are also in the home.
