### 2021 Council Chartering is in Full Swing

It is time to complete your Council's 2021 Chartering Agreement and it is available on our website! The chartering agreement can be accessed on the "Council Login" page. This should only be completed by one of your Council Officers or the Council Main Contact

The digital charter can be accessed by selecting "online form." There is still a printable form available if you prefer to print off and mail the charter and payment in. **If you have any questions about chartering, please contact [Kathy King](#).**



The cost to charter remains \$150.00. This cost includes one box (100 each of each English brochure, if requested) educational brochures and up to 2 boxes of pinwheels. Each pinwheel box contains 240 pinwheels. Additional boxes of pinwheels are available at chartering for \$90 per box. We ask that you plan ahead and order all your Pinwheels at Chartering time to save time and money.

Please note a couple of years ago we changed our policies regarding late submissions. Instead of increasing the chartering fee for each month that the agreement is late, we will now be putting a Council on "Provisional Status" until the documents and payments are received. Under a Provisional Status, we will not be able to provide Councils with materials, pinwheels, or discounts. If your Council is experiencing an exceptional financial hardship, please let us know NOW so that we can work with you, and help you develop a plan. You are also not considered Chartered until we have both your Chartering Agreement and Fee.

We ask that all chartering agreements payment and pinwheel requests be submitted by **December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020**. Thank you!!
