





No one has to abandon an infant. The **Indiana Safe Haven Law** enables a person to surrender an unwanted infant **anonymously** without fear of arrest or prosecution.

A parent, family member, friend, minister or priest, social worker or any responsible person may give up custody of a baby less than 30 days old to an Indiana...

## WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

- As long as there are no signs of intentional abuse on the baby, no information is required of the person leaving the baby. Any knowledge of the date of birth, race, parent medical history, child's health or anything that would be useful to the child's caregiver would be greatly appreciated (such as diabetes, HIV or other family medical history).
- Once the baby is examined and given medical treatment (if needed), the Indiana Department of Child Services will take the baby into custody through Child Protective Services where it will be placed with a caregiver.
